



CALL FOR APPLICATIONS

STUDENT EXCHANGE PROGRAM WITH UNYP, CZECH REPUBLIC


UNYT announces that it is accepting applications from students interested to pursue a semester-long (**Spring 2017-18**) credit mobility at the **University of New York in Prague (UNYP)**. Up to five (5) undergraduate students can be received by the hosting university. Selected students, however, are to be charged with home institution tuition fees, according to the number of credits of their mobility. In addition, all costs associated with travel, housing, living allowance, book expenses and any other costs related to the mobility are to be covered by the students participating in the exchange program. The host institution will not have any responsibility to cover any costs related to the incoming exchange students beyond the provision of tuition-free credit delivery. Successful applicants will attend a number of courses (in English) to be integrated into their UNYT curriculum, in consultations with their advisors.

Dead-Line for Applications: November 12, 2017, 17.00, Albanian time

Selection Criteria & their Weight: 1. G.P.A: 60% (no lower than 2.50). 2. Quality of application folder (40%). A second round of selection will be pursued by UNYP.

UNYP was established in April 1998 in cooperation with the State University of New York, New Paltz, and the State University of New York Empire State College. UNYP is the largest and most prominent English-language higher education institution in the Czech Republic.
